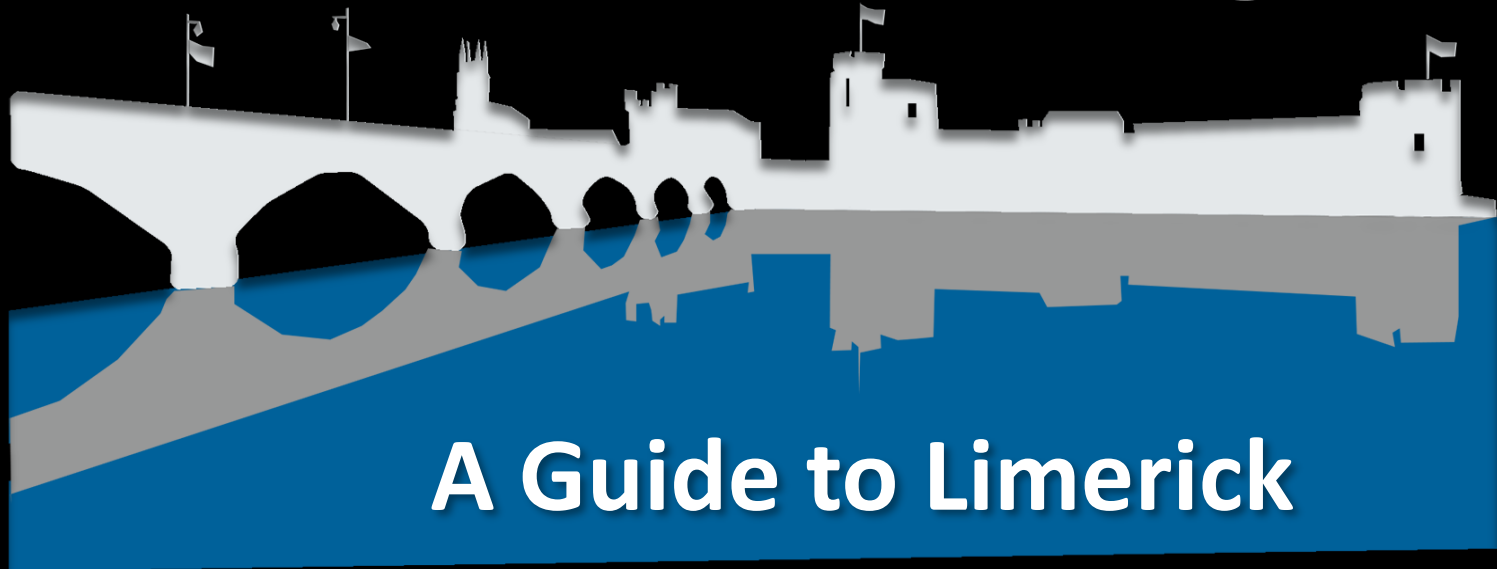

Thomond Park is the home ground of Munster Rugby, one of the most successful and best supported rugby clubs in the world. The famous venue, renowned internationally for its unique history and atmosphere, has been redeveloped and now boasts an increased capacity of 25,600 plus an extensive range of conference & banqueting facilities that have further enhanced its glowing reputation.

Hunt Museum

St Mary's Cathedral



[St Mary's Cathedral](#) has had a long and eventful history. It was founded in 1168 on the site of a palace and experts believe that parts of the palace are incorporated into the present structure of the Cathedral. The Cathedral has seen many changes as the city expanded around it and it remains today the oldest and most historic building in Limerick. No trip to the City is complete without visiting this historic building at the very heart of this ancient metropolis! Opening hours are 9am to 5pm (Mon – Fri); 9am to 4pm (Sat) and 10.30am to 4pm (Sun). During Oct – Apr; the Cathedral closes at 1pm on Saturdays and Sundays

Rock of Cashel



The impressive stone walls at the [Rock of Cashel](#) enclose a round tower, the cathedral, a 12th century Romanesque chapel, high crosses and other structures. The gothic cathedral dates back to the 13th century and includes a central square tower and living quarters. The steps of the tower lead to the summit roof walk. Opening hours 9am to 4.30pm (Mid Sep - Mid Mar); 9am to 5.30pm (Mid Mar - Mid June) and from 9am to 7.30pm (Mid Jun - Mid Sep)

Lough Gur is a magical and mysterious place that is rich in folklore along with a wealth of archaeology and history dating back to Stone Age times. The Heritage Centre provides a fascinating interpretation of the sites associated with Lough Gur and tells the story of Pre-Celtic Ireland dating back to 3000 BC. Bunratty Castle & Folk Park



[Bunratty Castle & Folk Park](#) is a chance to experience a window on Ireland's past and explore the acclaimed 15th century Bunratty Castle and the 19th century Bunratty Folk Park. Prepare to be charmed as you visit the farm houses and cottages and watch the tasks of rural Irish families. Opening hours are 9am to 5.30pm daily.

For evening entertainment enjoy the unique [Bunratty Castle Medieval Banquet](#) experience available twice nightly from 5.30pm - 7.45pm or 8.45pm - 11pm.

Cliffs of Moher



The [Cliffs of Moher](#) are Ireland's most visited natural attraction with a magical vista that captures the hearts of **up to one million visitors every year**. The Cliffs are **214m high at the highest point and range for 8 kilometres** over the Atlantic Ocean on the western seaboard of County Clare.

Other nearby attractions include the Burren Centre & Kilfenora Parlour, Caherconnell Stone Fort and Sheepdog Trials and the Aillwee Cave and Birds of Prey Centre.

Craggaunowen



[Craggaunowen](#) is the Living Past Experience, Ireland's original award winning pre-historic park of our Celtic ancestors of over 1,000 years ago which have touched and shaped how we live today. Explore the traditions and dwellings of the Crannog people, wander in the woods and see the goats, soy sheep and wild boar. Don't forget to visit the Brendan Boat* - a leather hulled boat built by Tim Severin who sailed across the Atlantic re-enacting the voyage of St. Brendan. Open daily from Easter Saturday to Aug 31st from 10am - 5pm.

Killaloe Village & Brian Boru Heritage Centre



Regal Killaloe, once the capital of Ireland as the 11th century seat of heroic King Brian Boru, is now the serene centre of leisure activity on Ireland's natural water park, Lough Derg. Killaloe bridges the centuries, as well as connecting counties Clare and Tipperary with its distinctive 13 arch bridge linking Killaloe to the pretty village of Ballina. Killaloe is the birth place of Brian Boru (940-1014) High King of Ireland - the greatest High King of Ireland, a colourful and influential character. Drop by [Brian Boru Heritage Centre](#) open from May to mid-Sept from 10am to 5pm.
